



Conservation Values

The Hogum Bay Protected Area features marine shoreline fish and wildlife habitats, including a gravel beach, a coastal lagoon and salt marsh, marine riparian forest, and a coastal stream.



Access



This Protected Area includes property owned by the Land Trust and a conservation easement held by the Land Trust on private property that is closed to the public. Please contact the Land Trust to find out about opportunities to visit this site.

The Hogum Bay Protected Area includes a small coastal lagoon, known as Mallard Cove, adjacent marine shoreline and surrounding forested uplands northwest of the Nisqually Delta. Intact coastal lagoons and their drainage basins are rare in the Puget Sound region and provide valuable habitat for juvenile salmonids and a diversity of other fish and wildlife species. In 2011, the Land Trust received funding for habitat restoration activities on this site, including control of invasive weeds and planting of native, shade-tolerant conifers throughout the forest understory.
